REPORT FROM THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN

Welcome to the Autumn 2009 and Spring 2010 season of U3A Torrevieja. A special welcome to new members, existing members returning from travels to goodness knows where (!!) and to those who may be reading this Newsletter for the first time and contemplating joining U3A. Welcome to you all.

Firstly I have to inform you of the resignation of our Chairman, David Evans. You may be aware that David has not enjoyed the best of health this year. David in fact commented on his health problem in the last Newsletter (June). The problem has not responded to treatment, neither here in Spain or now in the UK. I can assure you that David did not make his decision to retire lightly. He has always shown great enthusiasm and a real commitment to his role as Chairman. These roles will be in a temporary capacity until the elections at the A.G.M in January 2010. This will give continuity to the management of our Organisation for the rest of this year, plus both I and the rest of the Committee will still be able to benefit from David's knowledge and wisdom, albeit from a distance.

Although there were no "formal" meetings during the summer, and despite the incredible heat, for some Committee members this has been a summer of high activity. To those involved in the planning, preparation and execution of the very successful June, July and August coffee mornings I would like to express my sincere thanks. Special thanks to those ladies who baked the wide array of delicious cakes. Standing over hot ovens in extreme temperatures must have been a very unpleasant task indeed. Also, my thanks to you, members and guests, for attending and spending freely at these events, even in these financially constrained times.

The Press and Publicity team were also busy during the summer months, supporting the three social mornings and in the process gaining a greater awareness of U3A through the many press releases appearing in the newspapers.



WALKING GROUP

We finished last season with a walk in June along the flat sea front promenade, from Lo Pagan to Santiago de la Ribera. See photographs.



We start this seasons walking, on September 26th, with another flat seaside walk, this time at Santa Pola. Various points of interest on this walk are the remains of an old salt jetty, the relic of a salt boat, two concrete bunkers dating from the Spanish Civil War (1936-1939), the fishing port and the castle. Wow!! Please note this walk is not suitable for dogs.

Through the summer we have worked on putting together what we believe is an interesting programme of walks for the new season. Always aware of the differing capabilities of the group, some of the walks we have planned are flat, others with a low degree of difficulty achievable by most members plus some walks that will be more challenging. Trying to be all things to all people is very difficult indeed!!

We will continue to walk on the last Saturday of each month from September to June unless otherwise stated.

FOR YOUR SAFETY U3A MEMBERS WALKING GROUP

The following points have been collated after discussion with other Walking Groups. We ask you to read them carefully. They are made solely with your safety in mind. We want you to enjoy your walking with U3A and to be safe.

Always read the walk briefing notes carefully. Ascertain that the distance and the comments on the terrain are within your capabilities.

Note the walk start time and give yourself adequate time to drive to the start location, and park safely.

Note the guidelines given on footwear, the need to carry water, fruit/snacks and use of headwear and sun creams etc.

The use of an insect repellent spray is a sensible precaution.

Always follow the advice and guidance of the Group Leader.

Always walk on the left side of a public road. It is illegal in Spain not to do so, and in the case of an accident you may not be covered by your insurance, and you could also be held responsible for any damage done to a third party.

Ensure you have adequate insurance to enable someone else to drive your vehicle in case you become unable to drive following an injury.

It is always recommended that you carry a personal first aid kit.

It is important that you always carry your SIP card or proof of medical insurance cover when on a U3A walk

It is always recommended that you carry a mobile phone.

It is a sensible precaution to log both your SIP card number and your NIE number into your mobile phone.

Enter ICE (In Case of Emergency) on your mobile and enter the telephone number to be contacted in case of an emergency.
